- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations or in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use paste, foam, or gel formulations of insecticides in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octabrate tetrahydrate;
- The application of a pesticide determined by the EPA to satisfy its reduced risk criteria, including a biopesticide;

**Follow-up Notification to Persons in Parental Relation and Staff Pursuant to
Section 409-h of the New York State Education Law***

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-h, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

As a reminder, the Lindenhurst School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- Any application where a school facility remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application.
- Anti-microbial pesticides and products as defined by FIFRA in 7USC 136(mm) & 136q(h)(2);
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations or in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use paste, foam, or gel formulations of insecticides in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octabrate tetrahydrate;
- The application of a pesticide determined by the EPA to satisfy its reduced risk criteria, including a biopesticide;
- The application of a pesticide classified by the EPA as exempt material under 40 CFR Part 152.25;
- The use aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets. The use of any fogger product or aerosol product that discharges to a wide area will require parental/staff notification.
- Any emergency application of a pesticide when necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, provided however, that a good faith effort shall be made by the person making such application to supply written notice of same.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

*Written notification must be provided to all persons in parental relation and staff at the following intervals throughout the school year: at the beginning of the school year; within two school days of the end of winter recess; within two school days of the end of spring recess; and within ten days of the end of the school year.
